Application No. 15817 of Richard Brillantine, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3107.2, to reinstate the Board's Order No. 15127 dated April 17, 1990 in the Application of Richard Brillantine, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3107.2, for a variance from the minimum lot width and area requirements (Subsection 401.3), a variance from the side yard requirements (Subsection 405.9), and a variance from the off-street parking requirements (Subsection 2101.1) for the proposed subdivision and construction of two semi-detached dwellings and one detached dwelling in an R-2 District at premises 5501-5505 Hunt Place, N.E., (Square 5204, Lots 13, 14 and 15).

SUMMARY ORDER

The Board provided proper and timely notice of public hearing on this application by publication in the D.C. Register, and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 7C and to owners of property within 200 feet of the site.

The site of the application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 7C. ANC 7C, which is automatically a party to the application, did not file a written statement related to this application.

As directed by 11 DCMR 3324.2, the Board has required the applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements which are necessary to establish the case for variances from the strict application of the requirements of 11 DCMR 401.3, 405.9, and 2101.1. No person or entity appeared at the public hearing in opposition to the application or otherwise requested to participate as a party in this proceeding. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board, the Board concludes that the applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3107. The Board concludes that there exists a unique condition of the property which creates a practical difficulty for the owner in complying with the Zoning Regulations, and that the requested relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan as embodied in the Zoning Regulations and Map. It is therefore **ORDERED** that this application is **GRANTED**.

Pursuant to 11 DCMR 3301.1, the Board has determined to waive the requirement of 11 DCMR 3331.1 that the order of the Board be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions of law. The waiver will not prejudice the rights of any party, and is appropriate in this case.

THIS ORDER OF THE BOARD IS VALID FOR A PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS, UNLESS WITHIN SUCH PERIOD AN APPLICATION FOR A BUILDING PERMIT OR CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IS FILED WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSUMER AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS.


