BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT



Application No. 15939 of Lowell and Diane Dodge, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3107.2, for a variance to allow an addition to an existing nonconforming structure that now does not meet the minimum side yard requirements and will create a new nonconforming rear yard [Paragraph 2001.3(b) and (c)], and a variance from the rear yard requirements (Subsection 404.1) to construct an addition to a nonconforming detached single-family dwelling in an R-1-B District at premises 6407 32nd Street, N.W. (Square 2349, Lot 224).

SUMMARY ORDER

The Board provided proper and timely notice of public hearing on this application by publication in the D.C. Register, and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 3G and to owners of property within 200 feet of the site.

The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 3G. ANC 3G, which is automatically a party to this application, filed a written statement in support of the application.

As directed by 11 DCMR 3324.2, the Board has required the applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements which are necessary to establish the case for a variance from the strict application of the requirements of 11 DCMR 2001.3(b) and (c) and 404.1. No person or entity appeared at the public hearing in opposition to this application or otherwise requested to participate as a party in this proceeding. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board, the Board concludes that the applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3107, that there exists an exceptional or extraordinary situation or condition related to the property which creates a practical difficulty for the owner in complying with the Zoning Regulations, and that the requested relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan as embodied in the Zoning Regulations and Map. It is therefore ORDERED that this application is GRANTED.

Pursuant to 11 DCMR 3301.1, the Board has determined to waive the requirement of 11 DCMR 3331.1 that the order of the Board be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions of law. The waiver will not prejudice the rights of any party, and is appropriate in this case.

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
