BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT



Application No. 16034 of the Lucy Webb Hayes National Training School for Deaconesses and Missionaries, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3108.1, for a special exception under Section 359 for a health care facility to increase patient beds from 15 to 18 and six staff in a skilled nursing home on part of the fourth floor of the Sibley Memorial Hospital in an R-5-A District at premises 5255 Loughboro Road, N.W. (Square 1448-N, Lot 25).

SUMMARY ORDER

The Board provided proper and timely notice of public hearing on this application by publication in the D.C. Register, and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 3D and to owners of property within 200 feet of the site.

The site of the application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 3D. ANC 3D, which is automatically a party to the application, submitted a written statement of issues and concerns in support of the application.

As directed by 11 DCMR 3324.2, the Board has required the applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements which are necessary to establish the case for a special exception pursuant to 11 DCMR 359. No person or entity appeared at the public hearing in opposition to the application or otherwise requested to participate as a party in this proceeding. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board, the Board concludes that the applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR 3108, that the requested relief can be granted as being in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Regulations and Map. The Board further concludes that granting the requested relief will not tend to affect adversely the use of neighboring property in accordance with the Zoning Regulations and Map. It is therefore **ORDERED** that the application is **GRANTED**.

Pursuant to 11 DCMR 3301.1, the Board has determined to waive the requirement of 11 DCMR 3331.3 that the order of the Board be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions of law. The waiver will not prejudice the rights of any party, and is appropriate in this case.
