Application No. 16903 of Maggie A. Bolling, pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3104.1, for a special exception to allow an accessory apartment in an existing single family detached dwelling under subsection 202.10, in the R-2 District at premises 4513 Meade Street, N.E. (Square 5155, Lot 166).

SUMMARY ORDER

SELF-CERTIFIED

The zoning relief requested in this case was self-certified, pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3113.2.

The Board provided proper and timely notice of public hearing on this application by publication in the D.C. Register, and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 1A, and to the owners of property within 200 feet of the site. The application was also referred to the Office of Planning for review and report.

The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 7C. ANC 7C, which is automatically a party to the application submitted a letter in support of the application. The Office of Planning submitted a report in support of the application.

As directed by 11 DCMR § 3119.2, the Board has required the applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements that are necessary to establish the case for a special exception from the strict application of the requirements of 11 DCMR §§ 3104.1, and 202.10. No person or entity appeared at the public hearing in opposition to this application or otherwise requested to participate as a party in this proceeding. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board, and having given great weight to the OP report filed in this case, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3104.1, for special exceptions under section 202.10, which will be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Regulations and Zoning Maps and will not tend to affect adversely the use of neighboring property in accordance

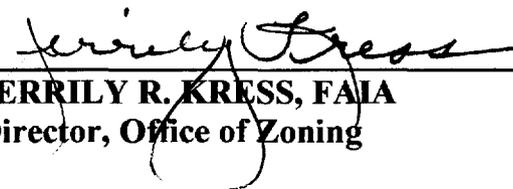
with the Zoning Regulations and Zoning Maps. It is therefore **ORDERED** that this application be **GRANTED**.

Pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3101.6, the Board has determined to waive the requirement of 11 DCMR § 3125.3 that the order of the Board be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions of law. The waiver will not prejudice the rights of any party, and is appropriate in this case.

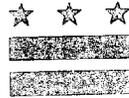
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MARITAL STATUS, PERSONAL APPEARANCE, SEXUAL ORIENTATION,

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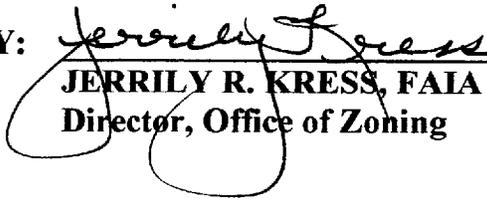
