PUBLIC HEARING - September 18, 1968

Appeal No. 9751 E. Ray Knickel, appellant.

The Zoning Administrator of the District of Columbia, appellee.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, with Messrs. Arthur B. Hatton absent and Arthur P. Davis dissenting, the following Order was entered at the meeting of the Board on September 18, 1968.

EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDER - Nov. 21, 1968

ORDERED:

That the appeal for permission to extend a nonconforming tourist home into basement of premises at 2647 Woodley Road, NW., lot 2, Square 2108, be conditionally granted.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

1. The subject property is located in an R-3 District.
2. The property is improved with a three-story and basement brick building presently occupied as a tourist home with ten rooms and two bedroom manager's apartment.
3. Appellant proposes to rent one of the rooms in the basement in connection with other room rentals.
4. No objection to the granting of this appeal was registered at the public hearing.

OPINION:

We are of the opinion that this use will not have an adverse affect upon the present character and future development of the neighborhood and will not substantially impair the purpose, intent, or integrity of the Zoning REgulations and Map.

OPINION Cont'd

This Order shall be subject to the following condition:

No neon or gas tube displays shall be located on the exterior of the building nor shall any such displays, if placed inside the building, be visible from the outside.
